Have you had ENOUGH?

Stress. Anxiety. Fear. These words capture well the state of mind of many of us in America today. As we look upon the November election to come, many feel hopeless, apathetic and even powerless. There are many reasons that this is the case, but, for a large number, financial strain and stress are a contributing factor.

In 2008 and the years following, we witnessed dramatic market losses, the collapse of the world's largest insurance company, and many bankruptcies and mergers. Every day seemed to bring another piece of economic uncertainty. An October 2008 survey found that over three in four Americans were stressed about the economy and their personal finances. Half were worried about providing for their family's basic needs. Over half of respondents reported feeling angry and irritable, and reported laying awake at night worried about this. The report concluded that, "The declining state of the nation's economy is taking a physical and emotional toll on people nationwide." Nearly eight years later, I believe this still is true for many. So, what to do? Where to turn?

Join us in worship, for four weeks, through late October and November for a sermon series and small group studies entitled *Enough: Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity*. Increasing consumer debt, declines in savings, lower income growth, and a volatile stock market are all part of our economic insecurity. We have lived in a society that tells us "you deserve it now," whether or not we can afford it or really even need it.

All of us have struggled with these issues at one time or another. They are important issues that we cannot ignore...



FINANCE COMMITTEE (By Dave Kistner): Dear Members and Friends - The Finance Committee would like to update the congregation on the church's current financial status. Through the end of September 2016, our total General Fund income was \$181,579 while our total expenses were \$204,238, resulting in a current operating deficit of -\$22,659 YTD. Significant one-time expenses in the summer, to enable capital upgrades to our facility and address needed boiler and electrical issues for the fall, have pulled on our reserves (see the adjacent Trustees Report). While we currently have a cash balance of approximately \$35,000 in the bank, we also must maintain this, at minimum, to support cash flow. Additionally, we must continue to raise funds to meet our operating needs.

I want to share with you my personal reasons for giving to this church. The ongoing ministries of our church affect many people's lives in a positive way that illustrate our commitment to Christ and living out the Golden Rule. Recently, WGUMC leadership committed \$3,600 to help close this gap, with still more commitments to come. *Can and will you help?*

FOOD MINISTRY (By Laura Daugherty and Kathy Harrod): Having taken our customary break in August, our Friendship Meals started up again this past September. Future meal dates include (2016) - October 16, November 20, & December 18, (2017) - January 15, February 19, March 19, April 23, May 21, June date of church picnic & July 16. No Friendship Meal in August. Should we experience bad weather on any of these dates, cancellation will be announced on KYW Newsradio and on the web site CBSphilly.com.

We continue to have visitors from the various religious institutions in our area as they work toward providing a meal for those who are food insecure. Indeed, as of this writing, there is a free meal being served somewhere in the community on every Sunday, as well as several weekdays. Our work is spreading! We provide flyers on a table in the hall in order to spread the word that these meals are available.

Other programs sponsored by the Food Committee include **Breakfast in a Bag** (available at the end of the Friendship Meal), **Brown Bag Lunches** (distributed by the office staff), and the **Friendship Freezer** (emergency meals for anyone who needs them.)

Your donations of luscious food, love offerings, prayers and your presence are what keep this ministry running. We are a mission of the entire church body. Your contributions are needed and very much appreciated, and as we grow, we need your help more than ever to serve our growing number of people.

Our goal is to be of service to our neighbors. If you want to have a positive effect on someone's life, do something rewarding, and also have fun. 

Remembering the Loss of Loved Ones



E. Marie Adair **July 27, 1921-September 15, 2016**

Marie Adair of Warminster, Pennsylvania died Thursday, September 15, 2016 at Ann's Choice. She was 95 years old. Marie was born July 27, 1921 in Abington, Pennsylvania, daughter of the late Lewis Dowling Whitaker and the late Ethel Richardson Whitaker (nee - Nederry). She is the beloved wife of the late Francis Adair; mother of Ronald Adair and his wife Elaine; grandmother of R. James Adair and his wife Jennifer, Janet Hauschild and her husband Steve; great grandmother of Kevin and Lauren Adair and Zachary Morgan; sister of Naomi Finney, and Loreen Kelly and her husband Henry, the late Vannette L. Rieco, and the late Reese Whitaker and the late Lewis D. Whitaker, Jr.

Marie was raised and educated in Willow Grove, PA. She was a 1939 graduate of Upper Moreland High School. That same year she entered a beauty contest at Willow Grove Park and came in second place for Miss Old York Road. When Marie was 14, she took her sisters Vannette and Naomi to the Willow Grove Park. While riding the Alps ride a photographer had snapped their photo. This photo hung in the local bowling alley for many years. Years later it was used as the cover photo for the Old York Road Historical Society's book about the Willow Grove Park. This cover photo was featured in an article published in the Philadelphia Inquirer. When the family saw this cover photo, it was then realized that the photo was of Marie and her sisters.

Marie married Francis Adair on January 24, 1944. They started their lives together in Willow Grove on Church Street for 7 years, moving to Cherry Street for another 7 years before moving to Deer Run Road where Marie would live for 56 years. Marie and Francis were happily married for 53 years before his passing on November 9, 1997. Marie worked as a telephone operator for Bell Telephone (Later AT&T) for 40 years in their Jenkintown and Fort Washington offices. She made many friends and continued her connection with them through the Pioneers for many years. Marie became a member of Willow Grove United Methodist Church when she was 9 years old and has been an active member ever since. At the time of her death she had the distinction of being the longest term member of WGUMC




